Understanding roles and structures

Description

The Construction (Design and Management) Regulations (CDM 2015) cover the management of health, safety and welfare for all construction projects. The Regulations help you to:

- Sensibly plan work so the risks are identified from start to finish
- Ensure sufficient time and adequate resource is applied at all stages
- Have the right people for the right job at the right time
- Cooperate and coordinate your work with others
- Have the right information about the risks and how they will be managed
- Communicate all information effectively to those who need to know
- Consult and engage with workers about the risks and how they are being managed

The course is suitable for all those who must manage projects within CDM 2015 or other professionals who wish to widen their understanding of undertaking and managing CDM 2015.
